

COURSES & REACH

The College currently offers courses in five academic disciplines — Neohumanist Education, Yoga and Intuitional Sciences, Liberating Humanities and Arts, Transformative Social Sciences, and Wellness and Psychology. In FY 24-25 we offered 15 courses with a student enrollment of 187. We have expanded our course offerings to 25 in FY 25-26. A list of our courses can be found on the <u>website</u>.



NHCA welcomed more than 60 students from 15 countries to participate in the 2025-27 cohort of the Teacher Preparation Program. We are offering translation services to accommodate this increase in non-native English speakers.




FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

The <u>annual budget</u> of the College is approximately \$150,000 which does not account for the many volunteers that support the operation including faculty and key staff. Of the eight-member core Team, four are volunteers. 60% of the faculty volunteer their time.

Despite the treasure trove of dedicated, capable volunteers, our tuition does not cover College expenses. Many of our students come from developing countries so we waive a portion of their tuition. We depend on contributions of talent and cash. <u>A mentorship program</u> began in September 2025 to increase the amount of tuition and decrease tuition waivers. This provided prospective students with assistance in raising funds from family and friends to cover a greater portion of their tuition.

In the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, the College posted a profit of \$27,000, \$25,000 of which was a one-time donation to be applied for the next fiscal year.




To increase cash contributions, the Board approved a Fundraising Committee who volunteer their time to ensure the future success of our organization. A <u>Fundraising Plan</u> that includes an Annual Giving Campaign, Planned Giving and an approach to high networth individuals went to the Board.



ACCREDITATION JOURNEY

To address the quality of our program, we are pursuing accreditation from the <u>Accrediting Council for Continuing Education (ACCET)</u> so that we can be assured that we can stand shoulder to shoulder with other institutions of higher learning and thus be considered for federal and state funding. At this time, we completed the self-evaluation and submitted it to ACCET in August 2025. We are proud of the many improvements in our systems and processes that have been implemented to conform to best practices in the education industry.
